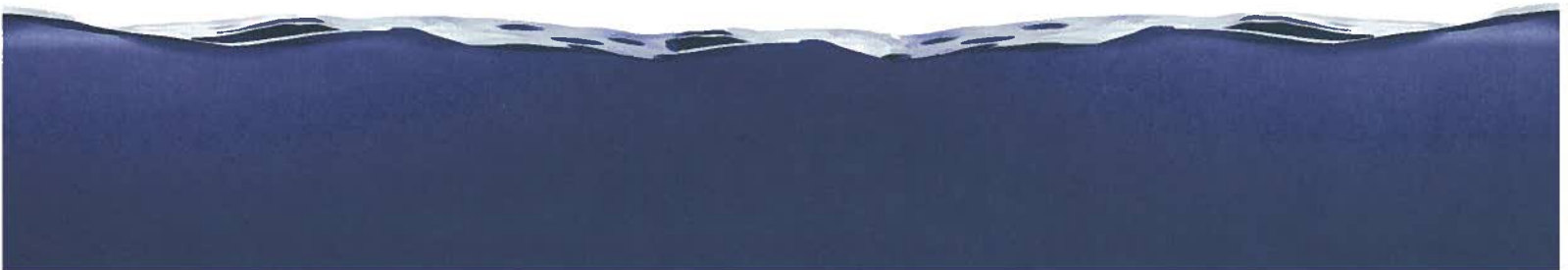

Dear Mr. Srivastava:

The Water Quality Control Division (the Division) is in receipt of the No Exposure Certification Renewal for Exclusion from CDPS Stormwater Permitting for the above-referenced facility. The Division has reviewed your renewal certification and, given the information provided, authorizes the facility to discharge stormwater under the “No Exposure” exclusion, conditional on the facility maintaining conditions at the site so that industrial materials and activities are not exposed to precipitation, as was certified for the facility.

Authorization to discharge stormwater from your facility under this renewed exclusion will expire on February 10, 2011. The Division will send out a renewal certification approximately 60 days before this certification expires. However, it is ultimately the facility operator's responsibility to ensure that the renewal is submitted.

If circumstances change and industrial materials or activities become exposed to precipitation, snow melt, and/or runoff, the conditions for this exclusion no longer apply. In such cases, the discharge becomes subject to enforcement as an un-permitted discharge. Any facility operator or owner who anticipates such a change in circumstances must apply for and obtain permit authorization prior to the change of circumstances.

To help ensure that the facility remains in compliance with the regulation, the Division highly recommends that inspections of the facility be performed on a regular basis to investigate the existence of any exposed industrial materials or activities that could require permitting.
